ADDENDUM A: BACKGROUND INFORMATION TO INFORM PLAN

Strengths

2021 scores showed growth or maintenance of scores in ELA, Science, attendance and college and career readiness.

2019 PVAAS ELA Growth Increased- All subgroups met or exceeded the growth standard

2022 ARC growth avg 9.7 months 2019 We were hoping to see more growth with the adoption of the ARC Reading program in grades K-5, but, with the cancellation of PSSA in 2019, will not be able to measure this until next year. Our data from ARC is promising at this stage.

2020 We have started using the Learning Progressions in our planning, which is helping to target instruction to the most important standards.

20212- All groups met or exceeded the growth target in ELA CDT and most groups met the growth target in ELA PVAAS

2022 - All students grew an average of 146 facts. Most classes started the program at the beginning of March

2020 all groups met the growth standard on CDT Science

Challenges

2019 PVAAS Math Growth did not meet 1 year's growth

2019 PSSA Math All Student Group Achievement Increased Slightly- 2019 performance at 26.6% below State Average of 45.2%

2021 math achievement and growth were subpar.

2022- 35.5% of all students were pro/adv, a decrease from the previous year. 2021 - 45.4% of students were pro/adv 2020 Despite our efforts in ELA, PSSA scores have not grown sufficiently.

2023 - 51.7% were on target in ARC.

2022-2023 new implementation of EnVision Math in k-5 2021 small group instruction was implemented in all classes, we are waiting to see if this made an impact. 2020 Lack of differentiated instruction in all classrooms. Those classrooms that used small group Math instruction demonstrated greater PVAAS growth.

2022 -Lack of alignment between our resource, Math in Focus, and the standards.

Strengths

2019 PVAAS Science/Biology Growth Increased- All subgroups met or exceeded the growth standard

Teachers aligned resources and instruction to the standards and focused on the most crucial standards in their instruction.

All students enrolled completed their required career development activities.

2022 Student showed positive growth in ELA, Math, Career Readiness, Overall, ELLs, ED and Hispanic groups grew at a higher rate than other groups.

2022 - all groups met the growth standard on CDT

2022 Hispanic growth in ELA, Math, and Science was greater than the all students group.

2022 Attendance was only 73.6%.

2022 ELA, Math and Science achievement did not meet the standard, nor did Science growth..

2019 - Our Hispanic subgroup is still performing below the state average.

2022 Our Hispanic subgroup did not perform as well as other groups in PSSA Math

2022 ELLs are performing significantly lower than their peers in ELA and Math.
